# The mission of the Major Hospital Foundation is to help support Major Hospital and Major Hospital patients through:

- patient assistance
- facilities and technology
- health education

## **Gifts to the Foundation can:**

- help uninsured patients access healthcare,
- help patients in need pay for their prescriptions so that they can be healthier and make fewer visits to the emergency room,
- help families struggling to meet basic needs avoid becoming overburdened by high medical debt.



### **•patient assistance:**

Helping support the improvement of the health, safety, and general welfare of all patients as well as helping to care for sick, aged, and helpless patients.

- Help provide a safe, modern facility where healthcare can be provided efficiently and cost effectively,
- Help provide state of the science equipment and advanced technology.



### **•facilities and technology:**

Helping support the improvement of the facilities and services of Major Hospital.

- Help provide opportunities for people to learn how to stay healthy,
- Help provide training for healthcare providers so that they are current on treatments and techniques of care.



### **• health education:**

Helping support knowledge about the discovery, prevention and treatment of disease.

# Patient Assistance: Helping with Vital Prescriptions....

- During 2009, the foundation made a \$9,600 grant to the case management department.
- The grant helps pay for prescriptions for inpatients who cannot afford the prescriptions they need to stay healthy upon dismissal.
- This helps keep patients from “bouncing back” into the hospital for the same reason as the first admission—they did not have necessary medications to manage health conditions.
- Remember, if a patient can’t afford medications, they certainly cannot afford a hospital stay—and medication is always less expensive than a hospital stay.
- Through 2009, **93 prescriptions were purchased for 55 patients at a cost of \$6,139, certainly saving money for patients, and potentially saving tens of thousands of dollars in uncompensated care.**
- The grant is being renewed in 2010.



# Patient Assistance Strategy: Leveraging the Foundation's Capacity to Help

***The following true story shows how the foundation is leveraging its fundraising capacity to improve patient health and outcomes while at the same time preventing cases of uncompensated care.***



A fifteen-month-old baby, whose young parents' many problems resulted in his having a wide variety of caregivers and inconsistent care at best, had visited the emergency room or been admitted to the hospital a total of eight times in his short life—all related to severe respiratory problems and asthma.

His grandmother finally secured custody of him and began to pursue reinstatement of his Medicaid so that he would have assistance in securing the medication he needed to manage his asthma and breathing problems. However, before Medicaid could be reinstated, he had another episode of severe respiratory problems, necessitating an admission. His grandmother did not have the resources to purchase the necessary prescribed medications to keep him healthy and out of the hospital.

The case management department accessed the prescription assistance program for this baby, purchasing his medications for him until his Medicaid became active. This child received assistance from the prescription assistance program in February of 2009. He has not been admitted to the hospital or made a visit to the emergency room related to his asthma (came to ER once for a fall and once for a rash that was not responding to treatment) since coming under the care of his grandmother and finding long-term assistance for his medications. The consistent care provided by this baby's grandmother, the diligence of the case management department, and the bridge to medication access provided by the prescription assistance program have combined to improve this child's quality of life as well as potentially saving thousands of dollars in uncompensated care.

## **Patient Assistance: The Patient and Family Support Fund helps patients and families during a stressful time by.....**



- Funding short term emergency needs for patients and families of patients:
  - Cab rides home upon dismissal for patients without transportation,
  - Gas cards, phone cards, and meal vouchers for families whose patient has been transferred to an out-of-town hospital,
  - Clothing for a patient to wear home,
  - Other small, unexpected, basic necessities that are related to a patient's hospital stay and that will help the patient successfully transition to home or another facility.
- Easing the stress of having to receive medical care:
  - Materials for holiday meal tray favors, small pillows, and baby hats made by volunteers, all of which provides a comforting, personal touch.
  - Comfort items for new Benesse patient admission kits—lip balm, hand cream, playing cards, scented candles, blankets,
  - Stuffed animals for children who “need a friend.”

# Facilities and Technology: An Important Component of Cancer Care....

In June of 2009, the much-anticipated Healing Garden at Benesse Oncology Center was opened! The Healing Garden is an integral part of Benesse's mission, which is to treat the whole patient—mind, body, and spirit—and was funded through charitable gifts to the Major Hospital Foundation.

*Clinical studies support the theory that nature helps patients heal, and the Healing Garden was built specifically with these theories in mind.*

- » *Reduces levels of stress,*
- » *Reduces the need for powerful pain relieving drugs,*
- » *Increases feelings of relaxation and well-being, contributing to a positive attitude.*

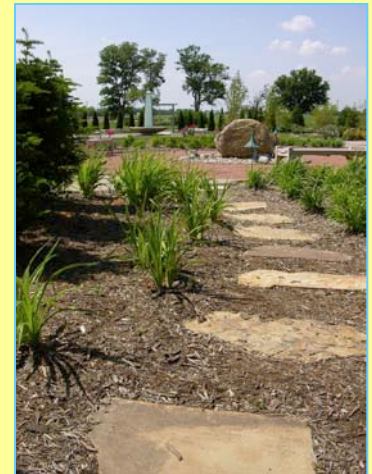


Teak benches under a cedar pergola offer restful seating. Benches were sponsored by many (see p.12 through 15 for a complete list of all garden donors).

A foot path offers a shortcut from the chemotherapy area inside to the Sensory Garden.

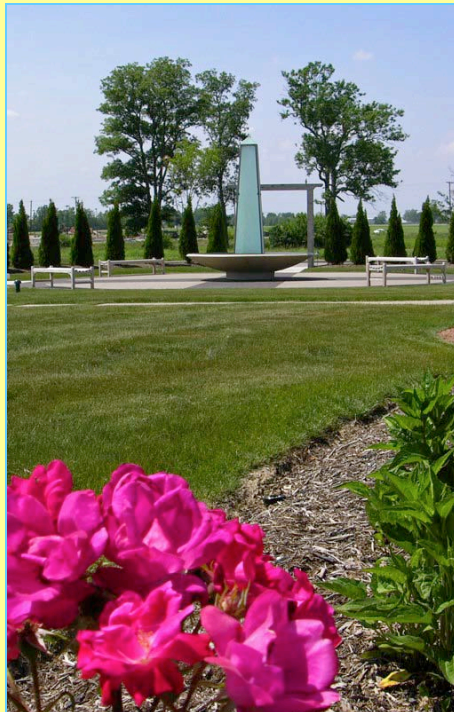
# Images from the Healing Garden....

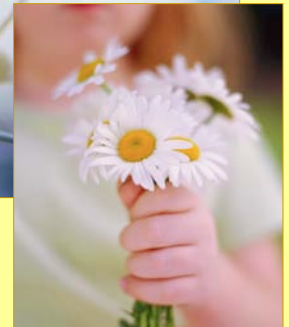

# McFadden & Compton Trusts: Legacies of Caring



Marian McFadden established the Marian McFadden Trust in her estate. She named the foundation as trustee and stated that income from the trust “shall be used for specific projects or improvements so designated by the foundation.” The foundation generally allocates income from the trust for capital purchases, including medical equipment and technology.

As a former hospital foundation board member, Marian McFadden understood that in order to provide superior health care solutions and optimal clinical outcomes, the hospital must have a stream of income to help purchase the best equipment available. Since Miss McFadden’s momentous gift in 1975, many pieces of vital equipment have been purchased with the trust income. We think she would be proud of her role in Major’s reputation for cutting-edge technology and equipment throughout central Indiana.

During 2009, the trust earned \$4,919 net of fees.

Mr. Compton created the Raymond E. Compton Trust in his estate. The terms state that income from the trust “shall be applied to the expenses of that part of said hospital as shall be incurred by any and all charity patients of said hospital and for no other purpose.”

People frequently put off vital health care because they are concerned that they simply cannot afford it. In the worst cases, people who need continuous health monitoring for chronic conditions like diabetes or hypertension ignore their health in favor of other expenses, which can lead to expensive and preventable hospitalizations. Raymond Compton was aware of this problem even thirty years ago and created this legacy in an effort to prevent it.

During 2009, the trust earned \$8,796 net of fees.

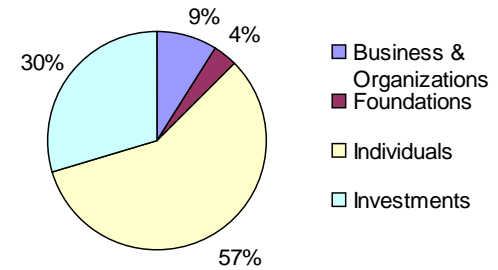

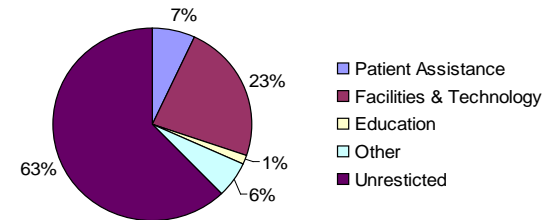

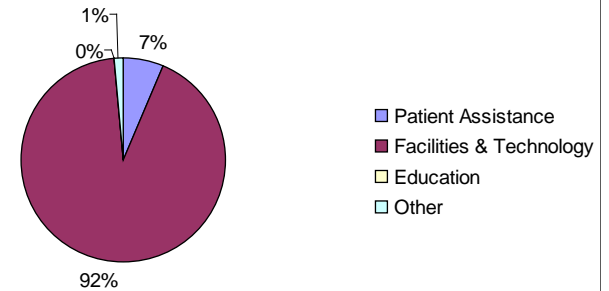
Sources of Income, 2010
