Permanent Gifts to Help Those in Need

Your gift of \$1,000 or more will be added to the principal of the Raymond Compton Trust, and the income will be used to help pay the hospital bills of qualifying patients. These patients are chosen based on federal poverty guidelines and have no health insurance or Medicaid.

The Major Hospital Foundation’s investment policy is designed for conservative growth, so that the trust will grow along with the needs of the community and hospital. Each year, 80% of the trust income is used to pay the hospital bills of patients in need, and 20% of the income is reinvested in the principal of the trust to allow for growth.

Raymond E. Compton, 1889-1979



Raymond E. Compton is frequently remembered as the operator of the former Alhambra Cigar Store in Shelbyville, but he also served his country during World War I and was concerned about homeless children and orphans. It’s possible that this streak of compassion is what led him to create his trust for charity care at Major Hospital.

Mr. Compton was also a charter member of Victory Post 70, American Legion; the chaplain of the post’s firing squad; and a past commander. He was named Legionnaire of the Year for 1975-76 and was 10th district committeeman for the Knighstown Home for Children of Soldiers and Sailors. He was also a member of the 40 & 8 Club and the local Elks, Eagles and Masonic Lodges.
